Save the Date: Memorial Service for Emmett Till to Be Held August 31, 2024

The Emmett Till Interpretive Center is partnering with <u>We2Gether Creating Change</u>, the <u>Emmett Till & Mamie Till-Mobley National Monument</u>, and the <u>Racial Reconciliation Task Force of the Episcopal Diocese of Mississippi</u> to host a third annual memorial service for Emmett Till on August 31st, 2024 in the Delta.

This year will mark the 69th anniversary of the kidnapping and murder of Emmett Till on the night of August 28, 1955 from his great-uncle Mose Wright's home.

"This event is important to me because we are acknowledging Emmett's name in our community," said Venita Halbert, Community Engagement Coordinator of the Emmett Till Interpretive Center. "Our organization was founded to break 50 years of silence in the Mississippi Delta about what happened to Emmett Till. We are changing the narrative. I'm proud we have a day when we can say his name out loud."

Everyone is invited to join us at 10:00am at Graball Landing where Emmett's body is believed to have been pulled from the Tallahatchie River. Graball Landing is one of the sites of the Emmett Till & Mamie Till-Mobley National Monument that was declared in July 2023. Following the service at Graball Landing, there will be a car procession out to the barn near Drew where the beating and murder took place. The event will end with a community luncheon in downtown Drew, MS, starting around noon. If you plan to attend, please RSVP so we know to expect you. Plans are underway to hold a much larger event in the Mississippi Delta next year to acknowledge the 70th anniversary of the murder of Emmett Till and the impact it had on the civil rights movement. More information will be forthcoming.
